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The following House Files were introduced:

West and Koegel introduced:

H. F. No. 4405, A bill for an act relating to amateur sports; dedicating certain sales tax collections to the Minnesota Amateur Sports Commission; amending Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 297A.94; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 240A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State Government Finance.

Lillie introduced:

H. F. No. 4406, A bill for an act relating to education; immunizations; removing a philosophical exemption from immunizations; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 121A.15, subdivisions 3, 8.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Education Innovation Policy.

Vogel introduced:

H. F. No. 4407, A bill for an act relating to commerce; providing funding for the financial institutions account in the special revenue fund; amending Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 46.131, subdivision 11.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Job Growth and Energy Affordability Policy and Finance.

Anselmo and Rosenthal introduced:

H. F. No. 4408, A bill for an act relating to the city of Edina; providing special law tax increment financing authority.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Rosenthal and Anselmo introduced:

H. F. No. 4409, A bill for an act relating to city of Edina; modifying the special TIF authority for Southeast Edina Redevelopment Project Area; amending Laws 2014, chapter 308, article 6, section 8, subdivisions 1, as amended, 3.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Bly introduced:

H. F. No. 4410, A bill for an act relating to liquor; creating a wine sampling license that authorizes a farm winery to provide samples and conduct tastings of wine at a farmer's market; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 340A.315, by adding a subdivision.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Regulatory Reform.

Hilstrom introduced:

H. F. No. 4411, A bill for an act relating to broadband service; prohibiting certain activities by Internet service providers serving Minnesota customers and those under contract to the state or political subdivisions; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 16C; 325F.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Regulatory Reform.

Layman, Bliss, Ecklund, Lueck and Fabian introduced:

H. F. No. 4412, A bill for an act relating to taxation; payment-in-lieu of taxation; limiting the valuation reduction for acquired natural resources land; amending Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 477A.12, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

H. F. No. 4413, A bill for an act relating to taxation; modifying the certified historic structure credit; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 290.0681, subdivision 4; Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 290.0681, subdivision 2; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 290.0681, subdivision 10.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

H. F. No. 4414, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for repurposing of the Cosmos elementary school; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Education Finance.

H. F. No. 4415, A bill for an act relating to taxation; modifying the credit for parents of stillborn children; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 290.0685, subdivision 1, by adding a subdivision.

H. F. No. 4416, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for segments of a multiuse paved trail and route around White Bear Lake; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Reform.

H. F. No. 4420, A bill for an act relating to state government; making supplemental appropriations for certain state agencies; changing allocation of rent collected on lease of certain state building spaces; changing provisions governing human burials, remains, and cemeteries; amending Minnesota Statutes 2016, sections 16B.24, subdivision 5; 307.08.
