INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

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The following House Files were introduced:

Engen introduced:

H. F. No. 3299, A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income; establishing a refundable tax credit for family members who provide child care; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 290.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Nadeau introduced:

H. F. No. 3300, A bill for an act relating to retirement; Public Employees Retirement Association; correcting employer failure to record service; requiring the payment of employee and employer contributions on omitted service and extending Rule of 90 eligibility for an eligible employee.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State Government Finance and Policy.

Kotyza-Witthuhn and Myers introduced:

H. F. No. 3301, A bill for an act relating to transportation; allocating a portion of regional transportation sales tax revenue to SouthWest Transit; amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 473.4465, subdivision 2.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

Kraft, Liebling, Frazier, Pinto, Howard, Falconer, Pérez-Vega, Freiberg, Reyer, Hollins, Berg, Smith, Curran, Kozlowski and Agbaje introduced:

H. F. No. 3302, A resolution memorializing the President of the United States to respect and comply with the rulings of the Judicial Branch in recognition of the Judicial Branch as a separate and co-equal branch of government, as contemplated by the United States Constitution.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary Finance and Civil Law.

Xiong introduced:

H. F. No. 3303, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for improvements to the Conway Recreation Center in the city of St. Paul; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.
