*Chapter 71, Article 2, Section 12 allows for the commissioner of commerce to delay, stay, or waive licensing, investigative, or other deadlines to provide relief or safe harbor from legal obligations with respect to licensees or other persons regulated by the Department of Commerce. This has potential to delay the receipt of a variety of license and application fees, and will have an unknown fiscal impact, but could affect various funds. The receipt of various affected fees may be pushed back from FY 2020 to FY 2021.
