INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

The following House Files were introduced:

Carlson introduced:

H. F. No. 99, A bill for an act relating to appropriations; appropriating money for continued, temporary operation of state government.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

DeLaForest introduced:

H. F. No. 100, A bill for an act relating to state government; ratifying amendments to the plans governing unrepresented and managerial state employees.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Larson introduced:

H. F. No. 101, A bill for an act relating to transportation; increasing motor fuel taxes; adjusting percentages of motor vehicle sales tax dedicated to transportation; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, sections 296A.07, subdivision 3; 296A.08, subdivision 2; 297B.09, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Larson, Hornstein, Loeffler, Hausman, Thissen, Paymar, Ellison and Davnie introduced:

H. F. No. 102, A bill for an act relating to transportation; adjusting percentages of motor vehicle sales tax dedicated to transportation; reducing appropriations for state road construction; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 297B.09, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Westrom, Latz and Nornes introduced:

H. F. No. 103, A bill for an act relating to pensions; police and fire fund; extending eligibility for survivor benefits by broadening the definition of active duty to include pension fund members in active military service; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 353.657, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS
