No. 122, A bill for an act relating to transportation; imposing highway user debt service fee on gasoline and special fuel; imposing 0.25 percent sales tax for transit purposes in counties of Anoka, Carver, Chisago, Dakota, Hennepin, Isanti, Ramsey, Scott, Sherburne, Washington, and Wright if approved in a referendum; authorizing issuance of \$2,750,000,000 in state trunk highway bonds; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, sections 296A.07, subdivision 4, by adding a subdivision; 296A.08, subdivision 3, by adding a subdivision; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 161; 296A; 297A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Smith introduced:

H. F. No. 123, A bill for an act relating to eminent domain; prohibiting acquisition by eminent domain for private economic development purposes; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 117.

Cox and Sviggum introduced:

H. F. No. 124, A bill for an act relating to health care; imposing a tobacco use health impact fee; establishing a health impact fund; imposing a floor stocks fee; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004, sections 297F.10, subdivision 1; 297F.185; 325D.32, subdivision 9; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 16A; 256.
