Murphy, E., from the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration to which was referred:

H. F. No. 3169, A bill for an act relating to state government; establishing a Legislative Salary Council; modifying a proposed constitutional amendment to stop lawmakers from setting their own pay; amending Laws 2013, chapter 124, sections 1; 2; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 15A.

Reported the same back with the following amendments:

Page 2, line 2, delete "November 30, 2016" and insert "January 2, 2017"

Page 2, line 8, before the comma, insert "and for the first term following redistricting"

Page 2, line 16, after the period, insert "Members that reside in an even-numbered district shall be appointed to a term of two years following redistricting. Members that reside in an odd-numbered district shall be appointed to a term of four years following redistricting."

Page 2, line 23, delete "board" and insert "council"

Page 3, line 26, after the period, insert "Any salary increase for legislators authorized in law by the legislature after January 5, 2015, is repealed."

Page 3, line 31, delete "state" and strike "legislators' ability" and insert "state lawmakers' power"

Page 3, line 33, delete "state" and strike "legislators" and insert "lawmakers"

Page 4, line 4, delete "Legislators' " and insert "Lawmakers' "

With the recommendation that when so amended the bill be re-referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
