INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

H. F. No. 5112, A bill for an act relating to corrections; authorizing partnerships for dental services provided in correctional facilities; requiring the commissioner of corrections to improve correctional facilities' dental services; requiring a report; appropriating money.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 5113, A bill for an act relating to labor and industry; appropriating money for hiring to support activities under the Safe Workplaces for Meat and Poultry Processing Workers Act.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Workforce, Labor, and Economic Development Finance and Policy.

Roach, Davis and Fogelman introduced:

H. F. No. 5114, A bill for an act relating to public safety; making it a crime to nudify an image of another; providing criminal penalties; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 617.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety Finance and Policy.

Rymer introduced:

H. F. No. 5115, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for reconstruction of marked U.S. Highway 8; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Gillman introduced:

H. F. No. 5116, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; modifying a prior appropriation for the Camp Craig Training Facility in the city of Hutchinson; amending Laws 2023, chapter 71, article 1, section 10, subdivision 10.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Roach, Davis, Wiener and Fogelman introduced:

H. F. No. 5117, A bill for an act relating to families; creating a parent's bill of rights; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 260C.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary Finance and Civil Law.

Swedzinski; Davids; Anderson, P. H.; Joy; O'Driscoll and Heintzeman introduced:

H. F. No. 5118, A bill for an act relating to taxation; local government aid reduction for denial of projects that would expand tax base; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 477A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.
