INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

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The following House Files were introduced:

Sencer-Mura, Xiong, Noor and Nadeau introduced:

H. F. No. 489, A bill for an act relating to workforce development; appropriating money for job skills training for recently released inmates.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Workforce Development Finance and Policy.

Becker-Finn, Hornstein, O'Neill, Kozlowski and Moller introduced:

H. F. No. 490, A bill for an act relating to transportation; providing for retroactive driver's license reinstatement for certain individuals.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

Lillie introduced:

H. F. No. 491, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for state trails; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Robbins, Davids, Witte and Burkel introduced:

H. F. No. 492, A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income; expanding the definition of qualified higher education expenses for section 529 qualified tuition plans to include distributions for apprenticeship expenses, certain student loan repayment, and elementary and secondary school tuition; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 290.0111, subdivision 2; 290.06, subdivision 2h; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 290.0131, subdivision 15.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Robbins, Davids, Witte and Burkel introduced:

H. F. No. 493, A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income and property tax refunds; allowing a subtraction for all federally taxable Social Security income; reducing the first tier income tax rate; increasing homestead credit state refunds; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 290.0132, subdivision 26; 290.06, subdivisions 2c, 2d; 290A.04, subdivisions 2, 4.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Robbins introduced:

H. F. No. 494, A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income and corporate franchise; allowing tax credits for parental leave costs; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 290.0131, by adding a subdivision; 290.0133, by adding a subdivision; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 290.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Pursell, Greenman, Kraft, Frederick, Freiberg, Bahner and Coulter introduced:

H. F. No. 495, A bill for an act relating to elections; modifying postsecondary student voter registration provisions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 135A.17, subdivision 2; 201.061, by adding a subdivision.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Elections Finance and Policy.

Klevorn introduced:

H. F. No. 496, A bill for an act relating to ethics in government; limiting certain types of contributions that grant registered lobbyists or other individuals special access to a meeting room, hospitality area, or other event space where public officials are likely to gather and the primary purpose of granting that special access is to facilitate informal meetings or socialization with public officials; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 10A.273, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Elections Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 497, A bill for an act relating to transportation; appropriating money for infrastructure improvements in the city of Madelia.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

H. F. No. 498, A bill for an act relating to transportation; establishing a highways for habitat program; appropriating money for roadside vegetation and living snow fence purposes; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 160.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

Nelson, N., introduced:

H. F. No. 499, A bill for an act relating to natural resources; requiring local approval before removing dam on Grindstone River.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Finance and Policy.

Freiberg, Hortman, Stephenson, Niska and Wiens introduced:

H. F. No. 500, A bill for an act relating to state government; providing for recognition of federal standard time year-round beginning in 2024 and expiring upon enactment of a federal law authorizing states to recognize advanced standard time year-round; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 645.071.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 501, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for replacement of the dam on the Grindstone River; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

H. F. No. 503, A bill for an act relating to transportation; establishing a reintegration license for certain individuals released from custody; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 171.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation Finance and Policy.

Hanson, J.; Hassan; Noor; Kozlowski; Frazier; Jordan; Hussein; Sencer-Mura; Bierman and Tabke introduced:

H. F. No. 504, A bill for an act relating to business development; codifying the small business partnership program; appropriating money; requiring reports; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 116J.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Economic Development Finance and Policy.

Noor, Xiong and Hassan introduced:

H. F. No. 505, A bill for an act relating to corrections; appropriating money for instruction to incarcerated individuals for employment after incarceration and work release.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 506, A bill for an act relating to public safety; appropriating money to fund a grant to provide equine therapy to first responders suffering from trauma and post-traumatic stress disorder; requiring a report.

H. F. No. 507, A bill for an act relating to economic development; authorizing immigrant worker enterprise zones; requiring law enforcement to comply with federal detainees; appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 116L; 299A.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Workforce Development Finance and Policy.

Edelson introduced:

H. F. No. 508, A bill for an act relating to civil actions; establishing a civil cause of action for the nonconsensual removal of a condom; providing penalties; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 604.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary Finance and Civil Law.

H. F. No. 509, A bill for an act relating to natural resources; modifying the Luce Line State Trail; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 85.015, subdivision 10.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 514, A bill for an act relating to taxation; property; exempting the city of Virginia from net debt limit.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

H. F. No. 515, A bill for an act relating to transportation; appropriating money for interchange construction in Becker; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

H. F. No. 516, A bill for an act relating to taxation; individual income; allowing an unlimited Social Security subtraction; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 290.0132, subdivision 26.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Finance and Policy.

H. F. No. 521, A bill for an act relating to energy; appropriating money for a feasibility study on the use of hydrogen produced by nuclear power plants in Minnesota.

H. F. No. 522, A bill for an act relating to local government; requiring counties and cities to have written procedures that are available to the public and to provide notice of availability to the public; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 471.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Finance and Policy.

Quam introduced:

H. F. No. 523, A bill for an act relating to state government; prohibiting an agency from vetoing election or appointment of a potential board member of a nonprofit organization; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 15.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Finance and Policy.

Quam and Davids introduced:

H. F. No. 524, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for a flood hazard mitigation project and public water infrastructure improvements in Kasson; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Quam introduced:

H. F. No. 525, A bill for an act proposing an amendment to the Minnesota Constitution, article VII, section 1; allowing owners of agricultural land, real property that is both nonhomesteaded and noncommercial, or small business property to vote on levy or bond referendums where the property is located.

H. F. No. 526, A bill for an act relating to taxation; allowing certain single-member LLCs to claim income tax credits for income taxes paid to other states; modifying the exemption for certain sales of property used in a trade or business; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 290.06, subdivision 22; 297A.68, subdivision 25.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Clardy, Huot, Vang, Reyer, Tabke, Curran, Her, Hill and Norris introduced:

H. F. No. 527, A bill for an act relating to public safety; expanding the fourth-degree assault crime related to health care professionals; requiring the commissioner of health to develop education and awareness initiatives addressing health care professional burnout and mental health issues; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.2231, subdivision 2.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety Finance and Policy.

Swedzinski introduced:

H. F. No. 528, A bill for an act relating to energy; requiring community solar garden subscribers to reside in the same county as the solar garden generating facility; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 216B.1641.

H. F. No. 529, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for drinking water and sanitary sewer improvements in the city of Bagley; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

H. F. No. 530, A bill for an act relating to taxation; increasing certain aid payments to taxing jurisdictions in Mahnomen County; amending Laws 2006, chapter 259, article 11, section 3, as amended.

H. F. No. 531, A bill for an act relating to natural resources; modifying certain conditions on water appropriations and wells; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 103G.271, subdivision 7, by adding a subdivision; 103G.287, subdivisions 4, 5; 103G.289.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Finance and Policy.
