H. F. No. 3443, A bill for an act relating to taxation; property; establishing the redevelopment area homestead credit; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, sections 273.1392; 273.1393; 275.065, subdivision 3; 275.07, by adding a subdivision; 275.08, subdivision 1b; 276.04, subdivision 2; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 273.
