INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

H. F. No. 3960, A joint resolution making a formal application to the Congress of the United States of America to call an amendment convention for the sole purpose of proposing for ratification an amendment to the Constitution which requires a balanced federal budget.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Kahn introduced:

H. F. No. 3961, A resolution expressing concern over persistent and credible reports of systematic, state-sanctioned, forced organ harvesting from nonconsenting prisoners of conscience, primarily from Falun Gong practitioners imprisoned for their spiritual beliefs, and members of other religious and ethnic minority groups in the People's Republic of China.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration.

Hansen and Mariani introduced:

H. F. No. 3962, A bill for an act relating to labor relations; clarifying terms related to meatpacking workers; providing for notification in languages other than English and Spanish; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, sections 179.86, subdivisions 1, 3; 181.635, subdivision 2.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Regulatory Reform.

Kahn introduced:

H. F. No. 3963, A bill for an act relating to higher education; requiring development of a pilot program for higher education income-share agreements; appropriating money.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Higher Education Policy and Finance.

Sundin introduced:

H. F. No. 3964, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for higher education asset preservation and replacement work on the University of Minnesota, Duluth campus; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Higher Education Policy and Finance.

Kahn introduced:

H. F. No. 3965, A bill for an act relating to health; requiring a study and report on the efficacy of Masgutova neuro-sensory-motor and reflex integration.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Reform.

Atkins introduced:

H. F. No. 3966, A bill for an act relating to capital investment; modifying the 2014 appropriation of bond proceeds for the Heritage Village Park in Inver Grove Heights; amending Laws 2014, chapter 294, article 1, section 17, subdivision 6.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

McNamara introduced:

H. F. No. 3967, A bill for an act relating to solid waste; requiring Pollution Control Agency to certify certain information regarding bonding proposals for solid waste facilities; requiring additional analysis in applications for state assistance for solid waste management projects; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, sections 16A.86, subdivision 3a; 115A.51.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources Policy and Finance.

O'Neill introduced:

H. F. No. 3968, A bill for an act relating to energy; prohibiting solar energy generating system site permits in certain instances; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 216E.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Job Growth and Energy Affordability Policy and Finance.

Anderson, P.; Dehn, R., and Davnie introduced:

H. F. No. 3969, A bill for an act relating to tax forfeiture; amending the period of redemption; giving county auditors additional authority; allowing counties to sell tax-forfeited lands online; allowing an eviction action when an individual holds over real property after a real estate tax judgment sale; allowing a landlord to dispose of an evicted tenant's property; making technical and conforming changes; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, sections 281.17; 281.23, by adding a subdivision; 282.01, by adding a subdivision; 282.02; 282.241, subdivision 1; 282.322; 504B.285, subdivision 1; 504B.365, subdivision 3; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 281; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 281.22.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Government Operations and Elections Policy.

Zerwas introduced:

H. F. No. 3970, A bill for an act relating to health; adding home health care providers and community-based services providers to essential community providers; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 62Q.19, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Reform.

Drazkowski introduced:

H. F. No. 3971, A bill for an act relating to taxation; property; modifying refunds of mistakenly billed taxes; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 278.14, subdivision 1.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.
