Quam, Gruenhagen and Newberger introduced:

H. F. No. 2310, A bill for an act relating to health; modifying isolation and quarantine provisions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 144.4196.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services Reform.

Barrett, McDonald, Atkins, Lillie and Urdahl introduced:

H. F. No. 2311, A bill for an act relating to economic development; establishing a tax refund program for restaurant and hotel renovations or repair; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 469.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Job Growth and Energy Affordability Policy and Finance.
