SF 2587/HF 3143 would expand eligibility of Housing Infrastructure Bonds to include the development and preservation of housing at 50% AMI and under for households that don't need wrap around supportive services.

Minnesota's greatest housing need is for housing units at 50% AMI and below.

Currently there is no funding source to build/preserve affordable housing units at 50% AMI and below that do not need wrap around supportive services.

Additionally, households of color are disproportionately impacted by the shortage of affordable housing and the cost of housing. 58% of black renters are cost burden compared to 44% of white renters.
