Minnesota Historical and Cultural Heritage Grants by County

July 1, 2009 - June 30, 2024

- 3,438 grants have been awarded to 998 organizations in all 87 counties.
- \$83,000,000 awarded in grants to date since 2009
- 100% return on investment
- Demand for grants exceeds funds available

History projects can take many forms; grants manual provides guidance on eligible applicants and eligible projects; grants manual outlines project types

Grants Office Staff

Grants office holds monthly workshops, many field visits and are available by phone or video call

Application

Applicant submits mandatory pre-application then final application for large grants via automated grants management system (Fluxx); application provides detail of project scope

Reviews

Staff conduct reviews of pre-applications and peer reviewers & staff review final applications. HRAC members read all applications and score submittals

approval

HRAC members deliberate on applications at a public meeting, using scoring, and the criteria in Grant Manual, HRAC recommendations are submitted to MNHS **Executive Council** (governing board) for final approval

Grant Agreement and monitoring

MNHS and Grantee sign Grant Agreement; Grantees agree to abide by MN Office of Grants Management Policies. Those not selected for grants are encouraged to work with the Grants Office to submit in future rounds.

Grants Management Highlights:

Ongoing monitoring:

- Signed Grant agreement/contract
 - Grants over \$50,000 require site visit or presentation
 - Interim reporting on work progress
- Grantee reporting before scheduled payments are made
- MNHS requires reporting before final payments are made
- Grantees submit evidence of completed work to MNHS; can be:
 - physical historic structure preservation
 - history program (exhibit, historic structures report)
 - equipment (e.g. microfilm reader)

Statewide History Programs -- Access

Laws of MN, 2023, Chapter 40, Section 2

Subd. 12. Legacy Arts and Cultural Heritage Access Days A portion of all funding from the arts and cultural heritage fund appropriations in this section must be used by grantees to improve access to programs, exhibits, and events that traditionally have a fee for entry. Grantees are encouraged to provide access to all community members using free programming days and to distribute free or reduced-cost tickets to improve access to all households throughout the state to increase participation in arts, history, and cultural programs that may be inaccessible due to cost.

History Partnerships

- History Partnerships encourage organizations to share financial resources and expertise.
- Partnerships may be between two or more organizations and may include MNHS.
- Partners in FY24 include the University of Minnesota, the Minnesota Alliance of Local History Museums, the Northern Bedrock Historic Preservation Corps and Rethos.

Statewide Survey of Historical and Archaeological Sites

- The survey provides opportunities to expand our understanding of historic and archaeological sites statewide
- Projects are defined by an oversight board including Office of the State Archaeologist, Minnesota Indian Affairs Council, State Historic Preservation Office and MNHS.
- Competitive-bid contracts are awarded to conduct projects.
- FY24 projects included a survey of Rice County and a revision of a handbook on pre-contact stone tools

Minnesota Digital Library

- Collaboration between MNHS, Minitex and other history partners
- MDL has partnered with over 180 organizations through the searchable online collection, Minnesota Reflections.
- Collection includes photos, maps, journals, letters, works of art and more.

Southeast Asia - 50th anniversary of Migration to MN

MNHS-administered Grants Program \$400,000 appropriated 37 applications = \$2 million requests 11 grants selected
