


Percent of Children who have Experienced Severe Trauma



Our Racial Equity Lens

Our racial equity value compels us to make decisions in the best interest of students. It is our collective responsibility to ensure that students of color have access to education that helps them succeed and contribute to our global communities.



Engagement of students of color was stronger than that of white students across the district, as measured by the Student Engagement Instrument (SEI), 2018.
