## **Bill Description**

**Section 1** of the bill creates an early dental prevention initiative, targeted at communities of color and recent immigrants. Components of the initiative will include working collaboratively with members of the targeted communities to develop and distribute educational materials and information, and developing and piloting incentives to encourage early dental care.

**Section 2** of the bill creates a grant program for dental operatory expansion.

Eligible dental clinics seeking grant funding 1) must be critical access dental providers as defined in Minnesota Statutes 256B.76, subd 4, and 2) must not restrict access or services because of a patients financial limitations or enrollment in a state public health care program.

Eligible projects include the addition of dental chairs and necessary dental equipment. Funding can be used for site acquisition, design, construction, and equipment costs. Grant funds are limited to up to 33 percent of the total costs of a given project expansion.

Applicants must describe how the project will be used to expand dental services. The commissioner shall give priority to applicants who demonstrate that the project will address an unmet regional need for dental care.

Grants may be submitted to the commissioner at any time, and eligible applicants shall be awarded funds, if funds are available.

The bill appropriates an unspecified amount from the general fund for the biennium ending June 30, 2017 for the development and distribution of the early dental preventive program. The bill appropriates \$2,000,000 from the general fund for the grant program. If unused, funds expire June 30, 2017.

#### **Assumptions**

**Section 1:** MDH assumes a 1.0 FTE Planner Principal State would be needed to develop and implement the statewide initiative, including convening stakeholders; developing or locating appropriate materials, assuring that health literacy concerns are addressed and best practices are incorporated; developing and supporting distribution channels for the materials; and developing and piloting an incentive program. Other expenses would include production, translation, and distribution of the educational materials and information; convening stakeholders and partners; incentives; and standard

office support costs. The bill appropriates funding for this initiative in the biennium ending June 30, 2017. We assume this is meant to be an ongoing appropriation. If that assumption is not correct, we assume that the fiscal note will be modified.

**Section 2:** MDH assumes 15-20 grants awarded during the biennium. Estimates are that one dental operatory costs \$150,000, 33% of which is \$50,000 per operatory. The grant would fund a total of 40 operatories, and MDH assumes that most grants would include more than one, given the large capital costs per project.

MDH assumes a .25 FTE State Program Administrator Senior would be required to work with dental stakeholders to administer the grant program which includes development and publication of an RFP, receipt of applications, selection of awards, contracting, processing invoices, site visits and evaluation.

## **Bill Description**

**Section 1** of the bill requires the Department of Health in consultation with the Department of Human Services to implement a statewide early dental prevention initiative targeted at communities of color and recent immigrants. Components of the initiative will include the development and distribution of educational materials and information, and developing and piloting incentives to encourage early dental care.

**Section 2** of the bill creates a grant program for dental operatory expansion. Eligible dental clinics seeking grant funding 1) must be critical access dental providers as defined in Minnesota Statutes 256B.76, subd 4, and 2) must not restrict access or services because of a patients financial limitations or enrollment in a state public health care program. Eligible projects include the addition of dental chairs and necessary dental equipment. Funding can be used for site acquisition, design, construction, and equipment costs. Grant funds are limited to up to 33 percent of the total costs of a given project expansion.

Applicants must describe how the project will be used to expand dental services. Priority is given to applicants who demonstrate that the project will expand services to Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare enrollees and other uninsured patients in underserved communities. Priority is placed on applicants who can demonstrate that the project will address a high regional need for dental care.

Grants may be submitted to the Department of Health at any time, and eligible applicants shall be awarded funds, if funds are available. The bill appropriates an unspecified amount from the general fund for the biennium ending June 30, 2017 for the development and distribution of the early dental preventive program and \$2,000,000 from the general fund for the grant program.

## **Assumptions**

This estimate assumes that one additional FTE will be needed to assist in the development of this statewide initiative. The bill requires collaborative work with MDH, health care providers and members of the target community on the development and distribution of materials for new and expectant parents within the target community. The grant program includes several specific criteria providers must meet to qualify for funding expansion projects which DHS will likely be required to help develop based on public health care program provider attributes. Staff will also be needed to assist with the development and distribution of educational and other outreach materials, convene with stakeholders, and conduct data analysis on public program recipients. We assume funding for an FTE based on a July 1, 2015 start date.
