

1.1 Senator moves to amend H.F. No. 1684, in conference committee, as
1.2 follows:

1.3 On R173, Senate language, (UEH1684-1)

1.4 Page 64, delete section 66 and insert:

1.5 "Sec. 66. TRANSPORTATION REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES; REPORT.

1.6 (a) The commissioner of transportation, in collaboration with the commissioners of
1.7 revenue and management and budget, must submit a report to the chairs and ranking minority
1.8 members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over transportation policy and
1.9 finance on transportation revenues and expenditures in Minnesota.

1.10 (b) At a minimum, the report must include analysis regarding:

1.11 (1) revenue sources for the highway user tax distribution fund, including detailed
1.12 information on how much revenue is generated on both a county and a per-capita basis;

1.13 (2) the various constitutional and statutory formulas used to distribute highway user tax
1.14 distribution funds, including detailed information on the amounts spent under each formula
1.15 over the past five years;

1.16 (3) expenditures for highway user tax distribution fund-related activities, including
1.17 detailed information on how funds are distributed to the trunk highway fund, county state
1.18 aid highway fund, and municipal state aid street fund, and expended from these funds on
1.19 both a county and a per-capita basis;

1.20 (4) the current number of lane-miles by system, functional classification, and surface
1.21 type, including roadways with two or more paved lanes, on a per-county basis; and

1.22 (5) the projected cost to meet Minnesota's transportation needs as identified in the
1.23 statewide highway investment plan under Minnesota Statutes, section 174.03, taking into
1.24 account specific factors that include but are not limited to (i) action needed to achieve
1.25 meaningful congestion relief, and (ii) labor costs to both maintain existing transportation
1.26 assets and expand to meet future needs.

1.27 (c) The report under this section must be submitted no later than February 15, 2022.

1.28 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."
