


Proportion of All Teacher Candidates Who Failed MTLE Exams by Race/Ethnicity

ALL EXAMS = 3,633





Six Main Problems with Teacher Licensing Exams

1. Not a valid predictor of teaching effectiveness
2. Not an accurate measure of all that teachers know, need to know or can do
3. Have not proven to increase preK-12 student achievement
4. Have been one of the major barriers to the profession for countless 1,000's of teacher candidates of ALL racial/ethnic groups over the past 20+ years who have otherwise proven effective while teaching on Tier 2 licenses, and/or successfully completing student teaching, clinical field experiences and standards-based coursework
5. Financial, time and emotional costs to teacher candidates
6. Although a majority of BIPOC candidates pass them, the exams disproportionately keep effective BIPOC teachers out of the profession. This is systemic racism.

***Solution:** Support HF320/SF619 and HF1257/SF1473 which will eliminate licensure exams for candidates who have completed rigorous, standards-based, Board-approved prep programs
