Re: HF 1975 – Film Production Tax Credit

Dear Representative Marquart:

I am writing in support of House File 1975 that would expand the production tax credit for motion picture and television production in Minnesota. Film and television tax credit programs have a proven track record of creating good paying union jobs, supporting local businesses through the purchases of local goods and services, and enhancing tourism from the images seen on screens big and small, a positive return on the State's investment.

The primary hurdle to attracting production is that there are currently 97 production incentives available around the world, which puts Minnesota at a disadvantage against competitors for production. While there are many variables that go into the calculation regarding where to film – locations, crew, infrastructure, accessibility, to name a few – the bottom-line cost of the project is an important factor to consider.

As you know, Minnesota has spectacular locations for filming and can match other parts of the country and world through a number of seasons, climates and topographies. Minnesota would be an attractive production destination with the right incentive in place. With your leadership and support, we believe HF 1975 will do just that.
