# Levee Improvements

## WHY ARE WE HERE?

- Carver's levee was constructed after the 1965 flood damaged 50 historic structures downtown
- Existing levee built quickly in response with nonengineered materials or design.
- **Deficiencies led to the City's removal from USACE** Levee Safety Program – City to pay for levee damage
- **Major flood events along the Minnesota River have** increased in frequency and duration
- Our goal is for Carver's levee to become FEMA certified levee






## Carver is Important to Minnesota

## Carver Is Invested In The Levee

The City of Carver has spent **\$1.2 million** on improvements to the levee including:

- Replacement of a stormwater lift station
- Improvements to drainage systems in Riverside Park
- Developed concept plans for levee improvements


