
## Housing is Health: The Health Needs of Youth Experiencing Homelessness

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
"Health begins where we live, learn, work and play."

23% identify as LGBTQ


**Figure 1.** Pregnancy and Parenthood are Common Among Youth Experiencing Homelessness



Youth experiencing homelessness are remarkably resilient in the face of trauma.

Nearly <u>half</u> of MN youth have experienced <u>physical abuse</u> and approximately <u>one third</u> have experienced <u>sexual abuse</u>.

An estimated 20 to 40 % of youth have experienced trafficking.



Health Risks Associated with homelessness exploitation incarceration foster care

Marginalization and Oppression

Trauma, violence, injury, abuse
Sexual health risk: STIs, pregnancy
Chronic untreated medical conditions
Mental health risk, suicide
Substance use
Barriers to care
Unmet basic needs (food, housing)


