### **Bill Description**

This bill creates two accounts, one general fund and one bond proceeds fund, to provide facilities grants to regional behavioral health programs. The bill identifies eligible applicants as a city, county, housing and redevelopment authority, publically owned hospital, or other public entity that is eligible to receive bonds. It also, identifies eligible applicants as a non-profit or regional consortium of organizations that serve individuals with mental illness or substance use disorder. Eligible projects for the grants are land, buildings, and other public improvements of a capital nature. The grants will be awarded to regional behavioral crisis programs that must, at a minimum, provide screenings and assessment, including individuals who are under arrest or subject to arrest or in immediate need of crisis services.

This bill also requires a report to the legislature, due by February 15 of each odd-numbered year, which must include information on the projects funded and the program and services provided in those facilities.

#### **Assumptions**

The bill authorizes the sale of \$30,000,000 in bonds and appropriates the proceeds for grants up to \$5,000,000 per project.

The bill does not appropriate funding to provide services. Additional funding streams will need to be identified by the legislature or providers in order to fund the services identified in the bill.

2 FTE will be required to implement this new program (assuming 6 months of SFY 2019):

- 1 FTE in the Mental Health Division for grant management, technical assistance to prospective grantees, stakeholder engagement and coordination with other program requirements
- 1 FTE in the Office of Economic Opportunity for fiscal monitoring and compliance, and project management and coordination with MMB
