Dear Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

My name is Beth Gendler, Executive Director with National Council of Jewish Women Minnesota. I am writing in support of Rep. Mariani's bill, House File 717, to create a Cannabis Task Force.

As the leader of an organization committed to social justice and equity, as well as an individual and organizational member of the Steering Committee of the Minnesotans for Responsible Marijuana Regulation coalition, I believe that now is the time to ask thoughtful, probing, questions about the legalization of cannabis in Minnesota.

There are many reasons I support the legalization of marijuana, but before we legalize, we must take the opportunity to consider the perspectives, nuances, challenges, and opportunities of our path forward.

My organization is chiefly concerned with improving the quality of life for women, children and families in Minnesota.
