I noticed the meeting tomorrow afternoon 6PM Wednesday March 17th meeting of the House Climate and Energy Finance & Policy <u>Committee</u>

HF2216 (Long) - Municipal utilities paying unusually high prices for natural gas in February 2021 loan program established, program established to defray high natural gas bills from February 2021 price spike for low-income households, and money appropriated.

HF1135 (Bierman) - Gas utility infrastructure cost recovery sunset eliminated.

\*\* HF2216 has been introduced and replaced the HFXXX / BE072.

There is an **additional risk of higher gas** bills because of other 2 bills that members might not be aware of because bills went through other committees.

Bills <u>HF72 / SF149</u> are already in the general orders or pretending to pass in <u>finance</u> omnibus bills **and entail serious additional threats in terms of home bills for heating**, additional to the increase from recent price hikes.

HF72 / SF149 want to put clocks of Minnesotans under DST during the winter. That would make house colder when people get up leading to higher gas consumption and heating bills.

Bills HF72 / SF149 should be stopped and replaced by new bills keeping Minnesotans year-round under natural standard time (natural time 365)

#naturaltime365 bills would decrease consumption from heating during the Spring and Fall and help alleviate the payers of gas bills.
