Dear Chair Olson and Members of the Ways and Means Committee:

Metro Cities, representing the shared interests of cities across the metropolitan area, appreciates the opportunity to comment on HF 207 (Tabke). Metro Cities supports this bill.

Pollinator insects lose food and nesting sites needed for survival when native vegetation is replaced by roadways, manicured lawns, crops, and non-native gardens. Converting traditional grass lawns has been identified as a way to increase pollinator habitat. Metro Cities supports funding for the Lawns to Legumes program, which provides grants, planting guides, and other resources for converting traditional lawns to pollinator friendly landscapes.

A map produced by the MN Board of Water and Soil Resources identifies much of the metropolitan area as having a high potential for rusty patched bumble bees. Residents and local officials are eager to make use of Lawns to Legumes grant funding to help protect the Minnesota state bee and other pollinator insects.
