Bill Description

Section 1 of the bill amends Minnesota Statutes 2014, 256I.04, subdivision 1 to add eligibility criteria for the Group Residential Housing (GRH) program to allow people who are receiving crisis stabilization services in a supervised, licensed residential setting and who receive medical assistance to be presumed eligible for GRH.

No effective date is specified, this is interpreted as being effective July 1, 2015.

Assumptions

This bill adds eligibility criteria for Group Residential Housing (GRH) to allow all people in licensed residential crisis stabilization services to be presumed eligible for GRH if they are receiving Medical Assistance (MA). It also allows people who are in a crisis residence to maintain their GRH housing payments in another setting. The bill also changes the calculation for the amount of GRH payment to be based on the number of days of stay, and does not include the individual's income. The individuals in this group would not have a client obligation toward their GRH payment.

The primary fiscal impact of this section results from increased GRH payments due to expanding GRH eligibility to all people in crisis residential settings who receive MA.

Due to systems work necessary for implementation, the assumed effective date in this fiscal estimate is December 1, 2015. DHS has advised the bill's author regarding this implementation timeline and the author is ameanable to amending the bill to align its effective date.

Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

The table below shows the number of days paid under MA for people receiving crisis stabilization services in a supervised, licensed residential setting.

Under this bill, GRH will pay for the days of stay for MA recipients in residential crisis services, so the total MA days from the table above is used as a proxy for the total number of days to be paid by GRH at the GRH housing rate of \$876 per month. In addition, we assume that total number of days will grow at 10% per year based on the actual growth rate from SFY11 to SFY14. GRH payment calculations will be based on the number of days and does not include the individual's income.

Systems changes would be required to implement the change in GRH. It is estimated that this change would be effective December 1, 2015. The delay is due to the need to add new fields to multiple panels in the MAXIS system. These fields are necessary to identify facilities that will provide crisis services to residents and then report on these facilities and fields. The cost is estimated at \$35,100 of which the state share is \$16,848. This estimate has been provided by MN.IT@DHS staff.

Note that the cumulative effect of all changes resulting from the legislative session will affect when this change can actually be completed. The Department will evaluate system changes and implementation dates for the omnibus package and will provide revised implementation dates based on the complete package.
