Bill Description

Proposes prohibition of manufacturing, sale, or distribution of food packaging that contains intentionally added Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) chemicals. Provides for enforcement by MPCA. Requires coordination with Departments of Commerce and Health.

Assumptions

- · Work would begin January 1, 2021, halfway into FY21.
- · One FTE will be needed for outreach and education, technical assistance, complaint response, random purchasing and sampling and screening of products, conducting any necessary enforcement follow-up, and coordination with other state agencies.
- MPCA will need to purchase some products for testing.
- A Fourier transform infrared spectroscopy (FTIR) is needed for product screening.
- · If the screening indicates the presence of PFAS, samples will be tested in an accredited lab. Assumed to be at the Minnesota Dept. of Health
- · Enforcement would likely be in the form of warning letters or having items removed from store shelves (No cost to MPCA and no revenue anticipated)

Bill Description

This bill would ban in Minnesota the manufacture, distribution for sale or use, and sale of food packaging that contains intentionally added perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) beginning January 1, 2021. The enforcement authority lies with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, in coordination with Departments of Health and Commerce. The bill adds a new law in *Minnesota Statutes, chapter 325F and* includes no appropriation language.

Assumptions

The department works closely with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency on similar initiatives, and we assume this coordination would be similar to those initiatives. While the department would not take a direct role in enforcing this section, pollution control is directed to coordinate with the commissioner of health in its enforcement. Specifically, the department assumes our role will be to coordinate with pollution control for outreach, messaging and education only when they find unapproved packaging via complaints. In our experience in similar sized programs, staffing equivalent to 0.5 full-time equivalent staff person is required to assist with outreach, messaging, and communication efforts.

The health department regulates food establishments where these products may be used as packaging for the end consumer. The department assumes no cost or responsibility to enforce this requirement as the bill places the regulations in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 325F, and not in the health department's primary food safety regulatory statute, chapter 157. Additionally, the bill explicitly states that the "commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency may enforce this section" in subdivision 3. Subdivision 3 does include a coordinating role for the health department, which is covered in our assumptions above.
