Bill Description

This bill amends existing body piercing laws.

Section 1 describes prohibited piercings.

Section 2 expands the definition of supervision to include definitions of direct supervision and indirect supervision.

Section 3 adds new requirements relative to supervised experience and safety training for all after January 1st 2016.

Section 4 requires the Commissioner of Health to notify a licensed technician 90 days before a license expires.

Section 5 requires that person applying for a tattoo technician license or a dual body art technician license must complete a minimum of 200 hours of tattoo experience under supervision and a body piercing technician or dual body art technician perform 250 body piercings under direct supervision and 250 under indirect supervision.

Section 6 clarifies that the identification requirement in subdivision 1 of §146B.01 apply only to clients who state they are over 18 years of age.

Section 7 sets consent and identification requirements for an individual under the age of 18.

It is assumed that body artists renew in March, and that 60% of persons with temporary licenses will go on to become fully licensed. It is assumed that the bill takes effective August 1, 2016 except for new licensure requirements, which take effect January 1_{st}, 2016.

It is assumed that there will be two allegations of prohibited piercings per year, taking 40 hours each to investigate, resulting in a 0.04 FTE increase for investigation and enforcement.

In total, this is a .08 FTE increase in workload between licensing and investigations. Support and management are allocated based on the additional FTE for licensing and investigations, for a total FTE impact of .1 FTE.

There is no revenue to support this expenditure.
