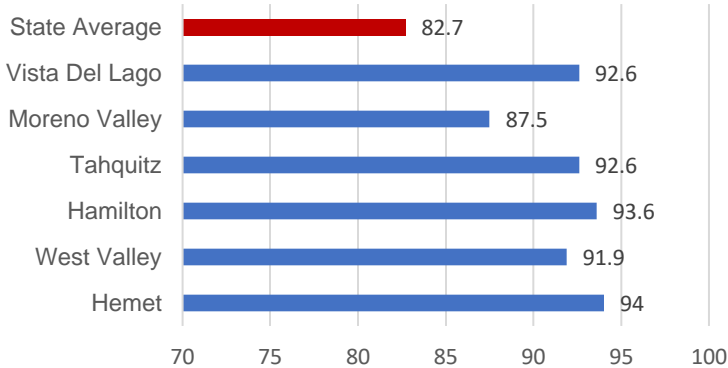
BARR Closes the Gap in Graduation Rates

The BARR has been proven to create statistically significant impacts in 19 areas of academic performance and outcomes for students, teachers, and schools, including especially powerful results narrowing opportunity gaps for students of color and students from low-income families.

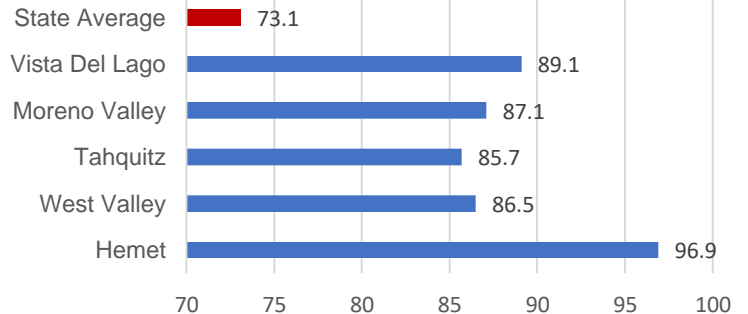

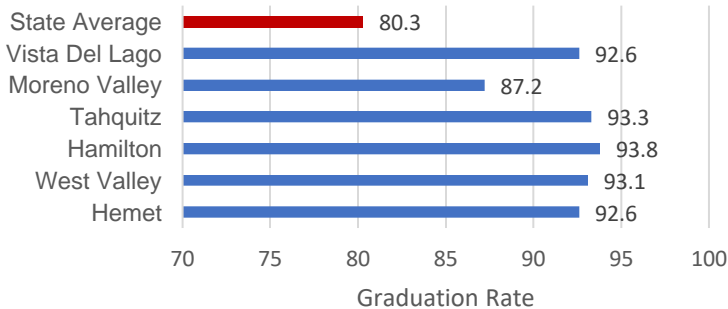
Overall Graduation Rate 16-17



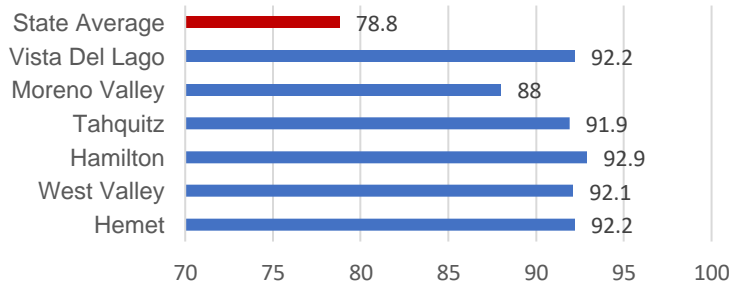
African American Students Graduation Rate 16-17



Hispanic or Latino Students Graduation Rate 16-17



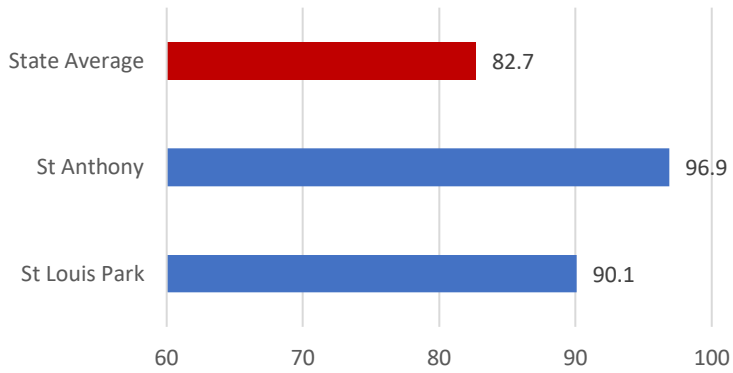
Socioeconomically Disadvantaged Students Graduation Rate 16-17



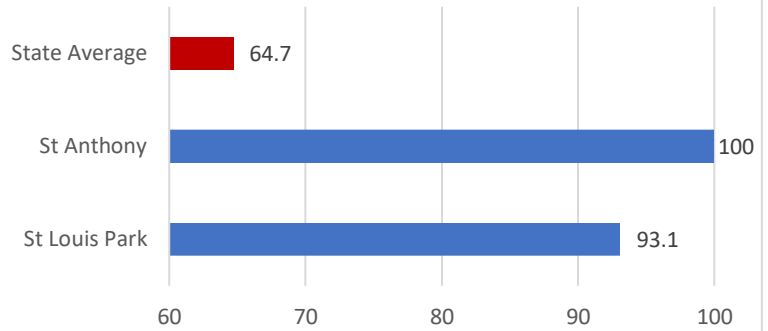

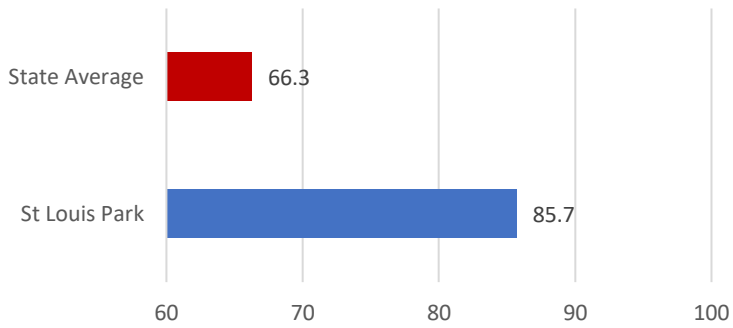
Overall Graduation Rate 2016-17



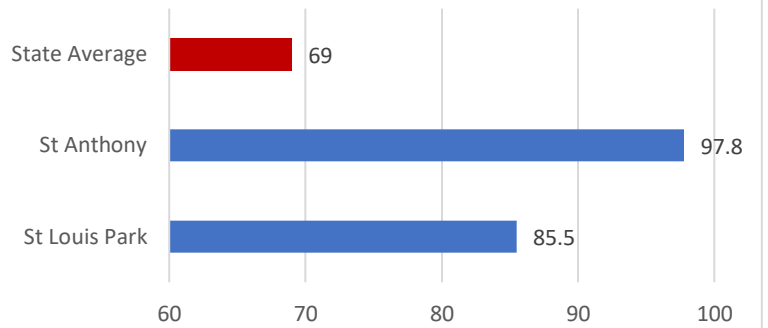
Black or African American Students Graduation Rate 16-17



Hispanic or Latino Students Graduation Rate 16-17



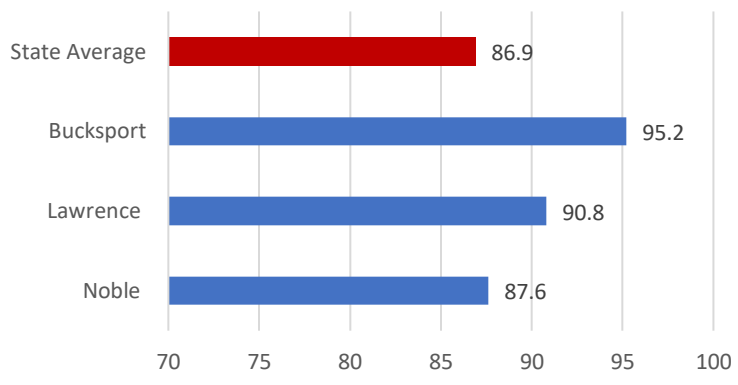
Free/Reduced Price Lunch Students Graduation Rate 16-17
