


Key Facts & Findings


- Voter information receives different scrutiny prior to voting
- Voter records may be inaccurate on election day
- Registration and voting by ineligible persons occurs
- Various organizations provide registration services, but barriers remain


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Information on the roster affects access to voting • Must register on election day if: • Voter information on roster is incorrect • Not on roster • Must complete an oath for challenged voters if: • Challenged on the roster, for most challenges

Most 2016 election day registrants updated or reactivated their registration Election Day Registrants (approx.)*

Updated registration 153,000

Registered for the first time 115,000

Reactivated registration 89,000

356,000

*Numbers do not sum to total due to rounding.

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Postal returns were behind most "challenged" voter records in 2017

Challenges

(approx.)

Challenged – Postal return 17,900

Challenged – Felony 7,800*

Other challenges 4,900

30,700

*612 persons challenged due to a felony conviction voted in 2016.

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A voter's listing in the roster may be inaccurate on election day

County Practices
Incorrect updates
Timeliness
Completeness
Inaccuracies

Apparent inaccuracies in felony challenges occurred in both directions

- In some cases, it appeared that challenges:
 - · Should not have been on the voter's record
 - · Should have been on the voter's record

RECOMMENDATION > The Secretary of State should develop a report to identify inactive, challenged voters who register on election day.


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Nearly two years of reports show ineligible persons register and vote

- Reports suggest 69 cases of persons registering or voting while ineligible
- Most investigations did not find registration or voting by an ineligible person
- But, reports:
 - · Did not include all investigations
 - Included investigations into voters' challenge status
 - Did not include detailed information

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Agencies reported providing voter registration services in 2016

- Law requires agencies to provide voter registration services to employees and the public
- 14 of 23 Cabinet-level state agencies did
 9 agencies provide services to employees only
 - Some state agencies reported uncertainty about providing services to the public

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Agencies reported providing voter registration services in 2016

 Law requires agencies to provide voter registration services to employees and the public

RECOMMENDATION The Legislature should clarify expectation of state agencies to provide voter registration services to the public.

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Agencies reported providing voter registration services in 2016

- · Secretary of State
- County and select city election officials
- Community Action agencies

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Community Action agencies identified registration barriers

- Understanding registration requirements
- · Feeling disconnected/disinterested
- · Lack of transportation
- · Other issues, for example:
 - · No proof of ID or residence
 - Language
 - Literacy
