## Sec. 3. <u>USE OF VENDOR TO FACILITATE RETURN OF ABANDONED</u> PROPERTY.

The commissioner shall, using a request for proposal process, contract with a vendor who will facilitate the return of abandoned property to owners. As consideration for such services the vendor shall receive up to seven percent of the value of the abandoned property, not to exceed \$500,000, when such abandoned property is returned to its owner. This consideration shall not be paid from the abandoned property itself. A vendor may not assess any fees, charges, or costs to the owner of the abandoned property.

## Sec. 4. REPORT ON UNCLAIMED PROPERTY DIVISION.

The commissioner shall report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the committees of the house of representatives and senate with jurisdiction over commerce issues by February 15, 2016, regarding the process owners of abandoned property must comply with in order to file an allowed claim under chapter 345 and the effectiveness of the vendor used by the commissioner to facilitate the return of the abandoned property. The report shall include:

(1) information regarding the documentation and identification necessary for owners of each type of abandoned property under chapter 345 to file an allowed claim; and
