

Minnesota's Community Health Centers




The Minnesota Association of Community Health Centers (MNACHC) is non-profit membership organization of Minnesota's Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs).


CHC Patient Insurance Status, 2013




Quality, Patient-Centered Health Care

- 78% of pregnant women entered prenatal care during the first trimester.
- 90% of patients have been screened for tobacco-use.
- 86% of asthma patients age 5 through 40 have a treatment plan.
- 71% of diabetic patients have HbA1c levels under control ($\leq 9.0\%$)
- The overall low-birth weight rate is 5.3% (compared to 6.0% for MN) and is lower than state averages for every racial/ethnic group.
