## **Little Africa Plaza** 678 North Snelling St.Paul









The Mission:

Build wealth & well-being in African immigrant communities by promoting entrepreneurship, small business development, micro-lending, homeownership education & community development initiatives.1/5<sup>th</sup> of Black Twin Citians are African immigrants, one third including American-born children.

The role of small businesses in immigrant communities is critical as language and formal education barriers lock many individuals out of the wider job market. In 2022, AEDS served 895 businesses with 10,000 hours of technical assistance, business development training to 126 people, created or retained 1,431 jobs and lent \$1.2M.

## The Project:

- Rehabilitates longest vacant building in the neighborhood
- Builds out a grocery/food hub to offer and promote African products
- Includes 2 micro-retail spaces for emerging entrepreneurs to test their ideas
- Contains a community/training room with an African museum
- Creates office and meeting space for AEDS and new businesses

## The Impact:

- Creates new business opportunities for African immigrant entrepreneurs.
- Expands markets by promoting African cuisine (the next food trend)
- Anchors the Little Africa Business & Cultural District
- Meets neighborhood food needs displaced by gentrification
- Increases AEDS business support services
