WHAT IS CENTRAL PARK?

Central Park is a regional multi-use indoor facility constructed in 2002 that provides a focal point and important gathering space for Woodbury, the east-metro area, and the entire state. Central Park facilitates community-building by linking many resources and people. It is an outstanding example of successful joint partnerships among various public and private stakeholders, including the Washington County Public Library, the School District 833 Community Education program (ECFE), Great Rivers Adult Education Consortium, the YMCA, Stonecrest Senior Living, and the City of Woodbury. The recreational and educational programming offered at the facility draws multi-cultural and multi-generational guests daily. Visitors appreciate the ease of access to many resources provided by the close partnerships and physical links among agencies.
