Research shows that high-quality youth development programs, like those offered by Boys & Girls Clubs, improve youth outcomes including school attendance, civic engagement, and graduation rates while decreasing participation in risky behaviors. The Social ROI of Boys & Girls Clubs

- ► For every \$1 invested in Clubs, there is a \$10.32 return in economic benefits to Club members, their families, and society.
- The ROI study measured improved physical and mental health outcomes, increased academic performance, increased lifetime earnings, reduced juvenile system involvement for youth members, increased caregiver earnings, and increased taxes paid.



Our mission is to ensure all young people, especially those who need us the most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

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For over 15 years, Minnesota Boys & Girls Clubs have collaborated with DEED to provide youth workforce training across the state. This partnership equips young individuals with essential technical and soft skills for the evolving job market. Programs include career exploration workshops, mentorship, and hands-on training, helping youth make informed career decisions. This initiative empowers young people and strengthens the state's workforce.

Programs such as SMART Moves and Money Matters offer essential training in **interpersonal skills and personal finance**, which are crucial for success in today's job market.

Career Launch empowers young people to explore high-demand careers, develop application and interview skills, and gain practical training and experience as they **prepare for post-secondary education and future careers**.

Over 5,000 young individuals engage in the Clubs' youth workforce programs throughout the state each year, establishing it as one of the largest statewide workforce development initiatives for those under 18.

In 2025-2026, the Clubs aim to broaden their workforce programs to **reach additional communities**, focusing on more **targeted career pipeline partnerships**, as well as career path navigation and mentoring.

Boys & Girls Clubs provide a safe and supportive environment where youth who need us the most can receive the academic assistance they need to succeed. Through programs like homework help, Exact Path, literacy and STEM activities, Clubs help ensure that all young people are achieving at their appropriate grade level.

One-time funding from MDE has offered Club youth access to the Exact Path program, which provides evidence-based personalized learning pathways in K-12 math, reading, and language arts. This program utilizes assessments to pinpoint each student's specific needs and deliver tailored instruction.

Minnesota Boys & Girls Clubs have expanded to meet the increasing needs of youth across the state. To further support these young people, Clubs are looking to expand academic assistance programs and strengthen partnerships with schools, including mentorship initiatives and strategies to improve school attendance.

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
