RE: Ways and Means Bill Referral Process

On Tuesday, January 8, 2019, the Minnesota House of Representatives voted on Temporary Rules for the House which included use of a Ways and Means Committee and Finance Division structure to handle bills with a fiscal impact. The structure was a decision voted on by the entire body. As Chair of the Ways and Means Committee, I am charged with implementing the structure in a fair and transparent manner. This memo is intended to lay out how bill referrals will be handled.

Bill Referrals and House Rules: It is important to note that the bill referral process does not change the House Rules that govern committee processes, including but not limited to public notice of committee meetings (Rule 6.20), public testimony (Rule 6.22), committee procedures (6.21) and records (Rule 6.24). Committees and divisions will still post bills, take testimony, do their work and vote on amendments and bills, etc.

Referral Process: A multi-layer notification of bill referrals will be used so members, staff and the public can follow the process and follow what is happening to bills. This approach will provide real time notice of action and a long-term record.

- After each round of bill introductions, if bills are referred to the Ways and Means Committee and should be referred to a finance division, a referral memo will be prepared. The memo will notify fiscal chairs and committee staff, chief authors (and their legislative assistants), the Ways and Means Lead Republican members and staff, and non-partisan staff of bill referrals and will be distributed as follows:
 - The memo will be posted on the Ways and Means Committee website under "Committee Documents" for a 2 week period. After that time, the referrals can be found in the "Committee Minutes" for each meeting.
 - o All House members and staff and anyone signed up for the Ways and Means Committee listserve will be notified via email that the referrals have been posted.
 - House Index will update the Revisor of Statutes bill status system on the legislature's website as soon as time permits to reflect the referrals.
- After the bill referral memo is posted, the contents of the memo will be included as part of the agenda of the next Ways and Means Committee and will be posted on the Ways and Means Committee website as an attachment for that meeting.
- The bill referrals will then be incorporated into the Committee minutes for that meeting, which serve as a historical record of the House.

Division Engrossments: As has been done in previous years, action adopted on bills in fiscal divisions will go up to the Revisor's Office for a division engrossment and will serve as the engrossment of record when it travels to the next division or to Ways and Means for final action. The division engrossment will be included on the Revisor bill status page for that bill along with other versions of the bill

Division Reports: Division reports on individual bills moving through finance divisions will be posted on the relevant division website under "Division Reports" to reflect division action. After a bill travels through the relevant finance divisions and is referred to Ways and Means for the final time before consideration on the floor, the latest division report will be adopted.
