Bill Description

This bill extends the 23.7 percent critical access mental health increase under the Medical Assistance (MA) program to include services rendered outside of settings that received the increase in 2007. Services receiving this rate increase include:

- · Group skills training when included as a component of children's therapeutic services and support
- Psychotherapy
- Medication management
- Evaluation and management
- Diagnostic assessment
- Explanation of findings
- Psychological testing
- Neuropsychological services
- Direction of behavioral aides; and
- Inpatient consultation.

The 2007 rate increase applied to psychiatrists and advance practice psychiatric nurses in any setting and by all licensed mental health professionals while practicing in community mental health centers and essential community providers. This legislation extends the rate increase to include all licensed mental health care providers when practicing in clinics and centers that are not designated as essential community providers.

Assumptions

This legislation extends the 23.7 percent critical access mental health rate increase for the services specified in statute to include all licensed mental health care providers when practicing in clinics and centers that are not designated as essential community providers. The effect is to extend the rate increase to all licensed providers performing the services specified in statute who are not currently receiving the increase. This rate change is applicable to both the Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare programs.

Under Minnesota Statutes 256B.69 sub. 5a, requirements applicable to managed care programs under 256B and 256L

established after the date of the contract take effect when the contract is next issued or renewed. Accordingly this estimate assumes January 1, 2018 effective date for the rate increase in managed care and assumes the July 1, 2017 effective date of the bill for the rate increase in fee for service.

This legislation would require changes to DHS claims payment systems to enable this new group of providers to receive the higher rate. This includes removing the logic which limits the rate increase to certain provider types reflected in statute. The state share cost of the required systems work is reflected in this estimate.
