- On R4, Senate language, (S0278-4) 1.2 Page 3, delete subdivision 17 and insert: 1.3 "Subd. 17. **Speciality drug.** "Specialty drug" means a prescription drug that: 1.4 (1) cannot be routinely dispensed at a majority of retail pharmacies; 1.5 (2) is used to treat chronic and complex, or rare medical conditions; 1.6 (3) has special storage, handling, or distribution requirements that typically cannot be 1.7 met by a retail pharmacy; and 1.8 (4) meets at least three of the following criteria: 1.9 (i) requires complex and extended patient education and counseling; 1.10 (ii) requires intensive monitoring; 1.11 (iii) requires clinical oversight; and 1.12 (iv) requires product support services." 1.13 Page 4, delete subdivision 20 and insert: 1.14
- "Subd. 20. Specialty pharmacy. "Specialty pharmacy" means a pharmacy that specializes in dispensing specialty drugs for patients with serious health conditions requiring complex therapies and high cost biotech and injectable medications. A pharmacy benefit manager or health carrier may require a specialty pharmacy to be accredited as a specialty pharmacy from one of the following accrediting organizations:

- 1.21 (2) Accreditation Commissioner for Health Care, Inc.; or
- 1.22 (3) Joint Accreditation Commission."
