

Chair Moran and Honorable members of the House Health & Human Services Policy Committee,

Thank you for your work this session on behalf of your constituents with disabilities, their family members, direct service professionals, and allies – especially in responding to their unique challenges and barriers during the COVID-19 pandemic. Below are provisions of interest in the A20-0745 amendment to House File 3104, and one item that we hope you will consider in future discussion about the health & human services policy bill.

Provisions of interest in HF 3104 A20-0745:

Article 2

<u>Sec. 2, 5, 6, and 7 – Sexual Violence Prevention Training for Direct Support Professionals.</u> The Arc Minnesota is greatly appreciative that our sexual violence prevention training proposal has been included here, as Direct Support Professionals are critical allies in the broad-based effort to prevent sexual violence against people with disabilities.

<u>Sec. 3, subd. 3(c)(5-8) – Assessment & Initial Service Planning.</u> The Arc Minnesota applauds efforts to ensure that assessments and service planning focus on *all* options available for home and work settings – not just those traditionally offered – and to support individuals with disabilities in building relationships that foster true belonging in community.

<u>Sec. 14, subd. 3(c) – Consumer Directed Community Supports.</u> The Arc Minnesota is grateful for the policy direction outlined here, as we fully support promoting Consumer Directed Community Supports (CDCS) as the most self-directed option available for individuals accessing Home and Community Based Services waivers. However, we hope to avoid placing additional burden on individuals and/or their family members in demonstrating that CDCS would be more cost-effective than other options.

Article 3

<u>Sec. 42 – Early Intensive Developmental & Behavioral Interventions</u>. We are deeply grateful for the Department's leadership in ensuring that children with disabilities accessing Early Intensive Developmental & Behavioral Intervention services are free from restrictive and deprivation procedures.

Other considerations:

In continuing discussion about the health & human services policy omnibus bill, we hope members will consider language from article 3, section 1 of the A12 amendment to Senate File 3322, which would codify Employment First, Independent Living First, and Self-Direction First policies. The Arc Minnesota enthusiastically supports this policy direction, helping maximize individuals' autonomy and self-determination while offering equitable access to the right type/amount of support at the right time.
