170 million tons of iron ore mined — producing enough steel to build more than...




3.5 million school buses.

School trust lands are an important and broadly misunderstood category of land ownership. They were established in the Minnesota Constitution to be held in trust for a single and specific purpose: to generate revenue for public schools.

The Office of School Trust Lands develops and advocates for sustainable asset management strategies that optimize long-term revenue for Minnesota's public schools. OSTL has a fiduciary duty to ensure that both current and future beneficiaries receive maximum economic returns from activities on school trust lands.
