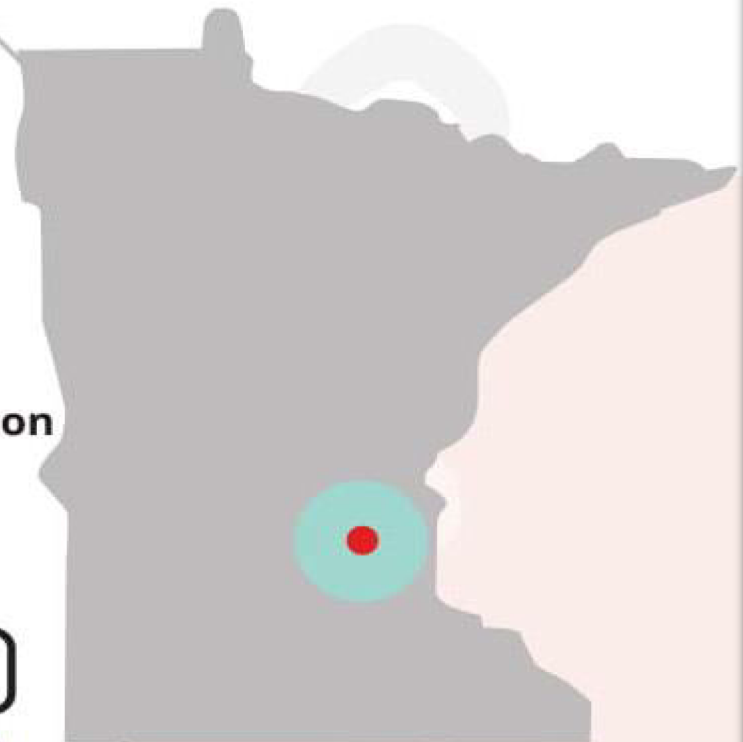

MAJOR INITIATIVES IN FY19

- Partnership with MN Regional Service Coops (facility, technology, & communication)
- Regional Arts Teacher Leaders (RATL Network)
- Pilot “Demonstration” School(s) in each Service Coop
- Updates & Preparation for Implementation of new Arts Standards in partnership with MDE
- Restarted the Comprehensive Arts Planning Program

REGIONAL ARTS TEACHER LEADER NETWORK

- Seeking a minimum of one teacher from each arts area from each service cooperative region
 - Must demonstrate qualities associated with effective arts education professional
 - Must apply and be accepted
 - Must be recommended by local Administration
 - Attend four (4) training events FY 19 (NEA grant supported)
 - Leadership – Advocacy – Communication -- Knowledge
 - Expected to be advocates and organizers for arts and teachers in their region
 - Eligible to host a Demonstration School event

DEMONSTRATION SCHOOLS

- Demonstration school events to focus on arts teachers of same discipline and grade level/band
- Invitation extended to all teachers in that region and beyond if space is available
- Primary topics to be driven by the needs of participants via data collected by arts teacher leaders

STATEWIDE IMPACT OF PD&R

[JULY 1 – DECEMBER 31, 2019]

- Served educators from 171 unique districts that serve over 560,000 students
- Completed 40 workshops lasting one to seven hours across the state
- Made nearly 1500 face-to-face contacts with arts teachers representing 600 school sites
- Spent over 500 hours working directly with arts educators
- Invited to assist with curriculum development and implementation in Minneapolis, St. Paul, Robbinsdale, Northfield, Worthington, Rochester, and Edina

CONTINUUM OF SERVICES AVAILABLE

- Tiered System Of Services
 - Tier I Introductory: 1-4 Hour Presentation/Workshop, One Time
 - Tier II A Day Of Targeted Professional Development, Or Providing An Day-long Or Multi-day Conference One-time
 - Tier III Support In Developing Capacity Of A Group Of Educators Over Time, Over A Year Or Multiple Years (May Include A Combination Of Workshops, Coaching, etc.)
 - Tier IV Impact A System Of Education Or Arts Education, Often At A School Or District Level

FY 19 PILOT COMPREHENSIVE ARTS PLANNING PROGRAM *(CAPP)*

- Provides assistance to participating public school districts as they plan and implement a comprehensive K-12 school arts education program (MN § 129C.25)
 - Must consist of school district and community members to promote comprehensive arts education in the district
 - Willingness to conduct a needs assessment of arts education in the district
 - Willingness to adopt a long-range plan for arts education in the district

LIBRARY

- Serves in two capacities
 - Traditional media center for the Arts High School
 - Professional lending library for K-12 educators (13,000+ items)
- Was relocated into a newly remodeled space in the education building after 3+ years in another building on campus

ARTS HIGH SCHOOL

MN §129C.10

ACADEMIC, INTENSIVE TRAINING IN THE *Arts*

- A comprehensive, tuition free, public high school available for 11th and 12th grade students throughout Minnesota
- Arts High School offers a rigorous academic program
 - Advanced Placement and College in the Schools programs
- Intensive coursework focused on six art areas: dance, literary arts, media arts, music, theater, and visual arts
- Residential Hall option for qualifying students

STUDENTS WHO CHOOSE THE ARTS HIGH SCHOOL...

- Accepted students carry an average 3.28 GPA
- Perpich students earned an average ACT score of 23.8 for in 2018 (*higher than the MN or US averages*)
- Perpich students graduated at an average rate of 98% over the past five years
- 2018 AHS graduates enrolled at post-secondary institutions
 - (63) graduates (74%) enrolled in post-secondary-fall 2018
 - (23) graduates enrolled at Minnesota post-secondary institutions
 - (40) graduates enrolled in other post-secondary institutions
 - New York (9), California (6), Chicago (4)
 - Montreal, Canada & Dublin, Ireland

Three points of emphasis for the Arts High School in FY19

- Student Admissions
- Partnership Development
- Visioning Project seeking input on “Perpich 2.0”
 - Innovative Academic and Arts Programming
 - Student Life at Perpich
 - Barriers to Attendance

CHALLENGES

- Public perceptions after 2016 legislative session
- Student enrollment
 - Total number of students
 - Increasing number of students with needs: special education, mental health, section 504, etc.
 - Student body that better reflects the demographics of our state
- Finding, training, and retaining a quality teaching staff that reflects our student body
- Technology infrastructure and devices available for high school and PD&R.
- Bonding for facilities security and maintenance. We do not have access to LTFM, safe-schools, or other dedicated funding streams that are available to other public schools

- Multi-faceted public relations program to boost enrollment
- Forging new partnerships & rebuilding others
- Supporting K-12 arts teachers statewide
- Seeking input on what we refer to as “Perpich 2.0”
