1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For purposes of this section, the terms in this subdivision
1.8	have the meanings given them.
1.9	(b) "Board" means the Board of Water and Soil Resources.
1.10	(c) "Local units of government" has the meaning given under section 103B.305,

1.12	(d) "Soil health" has the meaning given under section 103C.101, subdivision 10a.
1.13	Subd. 2. Establishment. The board must establish a cost-share program consistent with
