

LONG-TERM FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS

According to the 2015-2016 Legislative Fiscal Note Long-Term Considerations for the Montevideo and Bernidji Veterans Homes:

- Assumed cost to operate 70 beds in 2020, (if the projects are built and operating in 2020) salary cost of \$7,750,000 and non-salary cost of \$2,450,000 for a total of \$10,200,000, which includes an approximate 1.8% increase in salary costs per MMB guidance and a national average of approximately 4.5% increase in non-salary cost annually. The total FTE's for this home would be 103.
- A General Fund appropriation of \$5,230,000 would be needed for operation of this Home, revenues from residents would make up the remaining revenue to cover the cost of operations.

WHY MONTEVIDEO AND BEMIDJI

- Both communities have a federally required project pre-design complete.
 - Montevideo spent an initial \$70,000 on this project in 2008 and has completed updates biannually in order to have accurate project costs.
- Both communities have land ready for the project.
- · Both communities have Community Based Outpatient Clinics.
- Both communities have raised money towards the state's share of initial construction cost.
 - Montevideo has raised \$5,200,000
 - Bemidji has raised \$2,000,000

WHY MONTEVIDEO AND BEMIDJI

- Montevideo and Bemidji were both identified as ideal qualifying communities for Minnesota Veterans Homes in the 2009 MN Department of Veterans Affairs Community Identification Study for a new Veterans Home.
- Montevideo and Bemidji are larger rural communities and have hotels, bus & taxi services, American Legions, VFW's, National Guard Armories, retail shops, and much more, directly within the community.
- Montevideo and Bemidji both have advanced life support services & 24 hour acute care hospitals within their communities.
- Montevideo and Bemidji have reports from DEED showing ample prospective employees seeking employment in their regions.
- Splitting the allowed number of beds between two areas of the state serves more of our states Veterans in different areas. This keeps Veterans and their families closer together. The MNDVA has identified that operating Veterans Home with 70-90 beds is an ideal operational model.
- Our applications and locations meet both federal and state guidelines.

PROCEEDING FORWARD

- Montevideo and Bemidji need Minnesota legislative approval for the proposed Veteran Homes Projects
- After approval. Montevideo and Bemidji have completed all requirements and are ready to work with the MN Department of Veterans of Affairs on submission of an application for federal funding.
- In consideration of submitting three applications for Veterans Homes to the Federal Government:
 - In November 2013, the Federal VA notified the MNDVA that the number of nursing home beds requested (through federal applications by the MNDVA and local communities) in the State of Minnesota's grant applications exceeded the number of operational beds Minnesota is authorized by the Federal VA to have. Subsequently, all of the applications were returned because applications cannot exceed the States authorized amount of beds
- The proposed bills would allow Montevideo and Bemidji to separately complete Federal Applications for funds; not exceeding the states authorized amount of beds. We would utilized 140 of the 144 beds available.

MONTEVIDEO REGIONAL VETERANS HOME INFORMATION Per Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs criteria, the Veteran population within a 60-Minute calculated drive time county region surrounding Chippewa County includes 12,138 Veterans from eleven Western Minnesota counties including Big Stone, Chippewa, Kadiyohi, Lac Qui Parle, Lincoln, Lyon, Redwood, Renville, Stevens, Swift, and Yellow Medicine. Active National Guard Units within 60 minutes calculated driving time (all soldiers are approx numbers): Montevideo, Madison, Appleton, Marshall, Ortonville, and Morris- 340 soldiers Willmar- 220 soldiers Willmar- 220 soldiers Olivia - 160 soldiers Willmar Army Reserve HHC & FHC According to the United States Department of Veterans Affairs statistics Veteran Population Model 2011, which estimates living Veterans in Minnesota from 2010-2040, there will be an estimated 386,598 Veterans, Of these, about 42% (162,924) are under the age of 60 and 58% (223,674) are over the age of 60. Veterans from the entire state are eligible for new Veterans Home beds.










Northern Minnesota Veterans Home Information

- The sixteen Northern Minnesota counties include Beltrami, Cass, Clearwater, Crow Wing, Hubbard, Itasca, Kittson, Koochiching, Lake of the Woods, Mahnomen, Marshall, Norman, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, and Roseau.
- 27,658 veterans live in these counties; 18,155 veterans live in Beltrami County and the nine surrounding counties.
- In 2013, 50% of the veterans in the 16 counties were over age 65; this has now increased to **55.1%**.
- 1036 American Indian veterans live in Northern Minnesota. This is over 1/3 of all American Indian veterans living in Minnesota.
- 1,403 female veterans live in the sixteen counties.
- \$231.9 million provided by the VA in support of Northern Minnesota Veterans in 2015 (VA Geographical Data Expenditures Report).







Major Cost Differences between Veterans Homes and Nursing Homes All veterans residing in a Veterans Home receive per diem. At the basic rate this is approximately \$2.7 million per year. This will increase depending on the number of 70% service-connected veterans. Veterans Home residents have a maximum cost they will pay for their care. Nursing Home costs will continue to rise according to level of care needed.
