Dear Conference Committee Members,

Please do not support the new tax increases currently contained in the Senate Tax bill, related to vapor products.

Vapor products are the most popular method for adults looking to quit smoking in Minnesota, according to the Minnesota Adult Tobacco Survey conducted by the Mn Dept of Health. Countless Minnesotans have successfully found an alternative to smoking, by using these products. Most who turn to vapor products do so with the intention of decreasing their nicotine intake over time and in fact, many adults have successfully stepped all the way down to **zero nicotine** e-liquids and quitting vapor all together.

Raising taxes on vapor products - to a level even higher than the current taxes on cigarettes - is simply a backwards policy and will make it more difficult (and less appealing, financially) for Minnesotans to kick the habit.

Specifically, the 5 cents per ml tax would <u>reduce</u> the taxes on closed system products that contain higher nicotine levels and <u>raise</u> the taxes of open system products that have significantly lower nicotine content. Open system e-liquid products are primarily manufactured in-state, by Minnesota small businesses and sold in adult-only retail shops. Our regional organization represents the small retailers and manufacturers throughout the state that are opposed these provisions at this time and we ask you to NOT include these in the final tax bill.

We would welcome a more open and thorough discussion of how these products are currently being taxed in an effort to reach a fair compromise. Please do NOT include **Article 9 Sec 16-19** in the final Tax bill.
