Dear Chair Schomacker:

Thank you for being a champion within the Health and Human Service fields.

We are submitting this joint letter of support for the EIDBI policy bill, HF 919. We believe that passage this year is critical for multiple reasons:

- As you know, the legislature first passed the EIDBI benefit in 2013. The intent was to develop another option for delivering early intensive intervention to children with significant and complex needs. Implementation unfortunately was slowed by subsequent changes to federal rules. HF 919 will bring the EIDBI benefit into alignment and increase access for children and families.
- HF 919 incorporates a significant amount of input from the community. This year's bill was worked out prior to session, and we do not believe that it contains any controversial provisions.
- In addition, this bill also will continue families' access to other essential services, including CTSS mental health, occupational therapy, and speech therapy.

Because of all of these reasons, the stakeholders listed on this letter are in support of the bill.

Finally, we want to communicate our desire that HF 919 remains a single-subject bill. Although EIDBI is just one of several issues that are equally critical to individuals with autism and their families, we agree that this bill is exclusively focused on implementing EIDBI.
