Representative Pelowski,

As a follow-up to your question during the House Higher Education Committee hearing on 1/31/23:

What is the breakdown of projected tuition increases for resident undergraduate students at each campus as part of the University's current budget modeling: what does the University project to increase tuition at each campus even if its full budget request is funded?

The Board of Regents will not act on a tuition rate increase for FY 2024 until June 2023, and will not act on a tuition rate increase for FY 2025 until June 2024. For <u>planning purposes</u>, the University is currently modeling a 3.5% tuition rate increase for resident undergraduate students at UMTC and a 1% tuition rate increase for resident undergraduate students at UMC, UMD, UMM, and UMR in each of the next two years. These modeling assumptions assume full approval of the biennial budget request. In this modeling, the following would apply to the resident undergraduate tuition rates:

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Even if the full biennial budget request is approved, these tuition rate assumptions are subject to change based on the Board of Regents' review and action on the University's annual budget.
