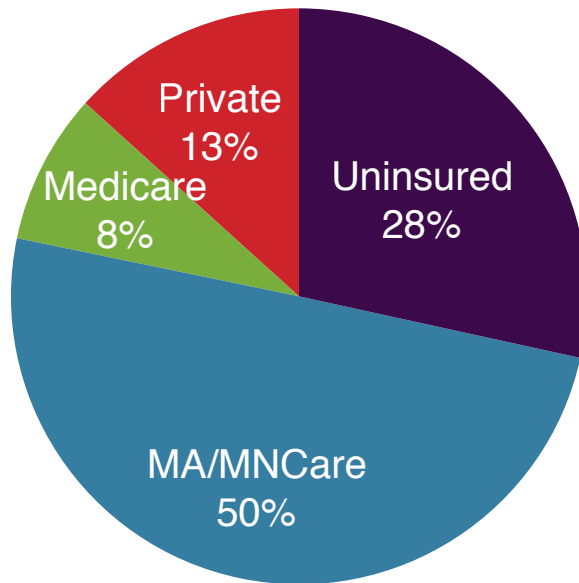


The Minnesota Association of Community Health Centers (MNACHC) is non-profit membership organization of Minnesota's Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs).

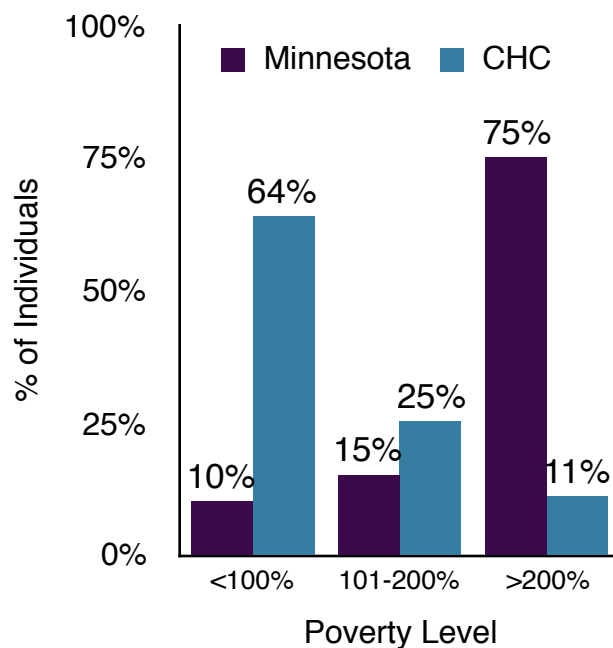
CHC Patient Insurance Status



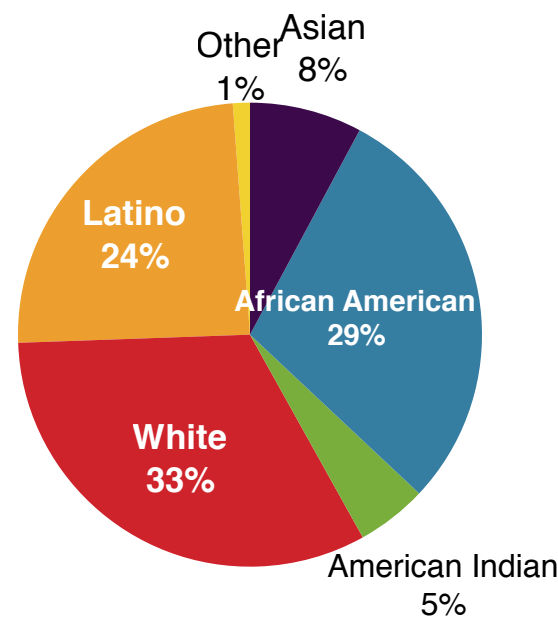
Quality, Patient-Centered Health Care

- 76% of pregnant women entered prenatal care during the first trimester.
- 80% of patients have been screened for tobacco-use and provided cessation services.
- 82% of asthma patients age 5 through 40 have a treatment plan.
- 75% of diabetic patients have HbA1c levels under control (<=9.0%)
- The overall low-birth weight rate is 5.8% (compared to 6.0% for MN) and is lower than state averages for every racial/ethnic group.
