Bill Description

House File 3312/SF3310 modifies the forest products permit at M.S. 169.8261 to allow a second type of permit for the same weight and conditions as the original permit, and also allows oversize loads of up to 10 feet in width, or no more than 102 inches on interstate highways and the seven-county metropolitan area.

Assumptions

After discussing with industry officials, MnDOT believes no additional revenue will occur as no new permits will be issued. Rather, requests would be split between the existing and new permit types and both types cost \$300 each.

MnDOT does not believe additional expenditures will occur. There will be no system costs to add the new permit, very minimal operations costs, and no need to post signs on roads or bridges for the wider loads.

Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

There is no fiscal impact to MnDOT.

Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

None.

Local Fiscal Impact

There will be a need to evaluate and may be a need for local authorities to post signs at some roads or bridges due to the oversize loads.
