Bill Description

This bill will allow new and used school buses sold by a dealer in the state to be issued an interim inspection certificate by the dealer provided the bus complies with applicable provisions of state law regarding construction, design equipment and color.

The interim certificate must include the date of the inspection and must be valid until the owner's next scheduled annual inspection, but must not be valid for more than 12 months following the month of the initial inspection.

The commissioner must provide the prescribed interim inspection certificates at no cost to the dealer.

Assumptions

DPS/State Patrol currently provides the inspection certificates and this will continue to be the process. There is no fiscal impact to the State Patrol.
