I was able to tell her that while it looked like the Zoo was north of University Ave on a map it was a long, long way north and one could not walk up Hamline to get there. (BNSF train tracks in the way) I was able to help her get off at Lexington and switch to a Route 83 bu,s which took them to the Zoo.

This public face of a caring Metro Transit is just what we need for both residents and visitors to the Twin Cities. Those without their own personal automobile should not be penalized and ridership should be encouraged. I think Transit Ambassadors assisting the public is a great idea and I hope it is implemented. A much better way to spend our transit dollar than on overpolicing.
