Bill Description

Section 1 of this bill requires the Board of Teaching to add best practices for suicide prevention training to rules addressing the renewal of teachers continuing licenses.

Section 2 of this bill adds two categories to the suicide prevention grant program of the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH): community-based programs to provide evidence-based suicide prevention and intervention training, and community-based, evidence-based postvention training. Funds for this section are appropriated in Section 4.

Section 3 of this bill requires the Department of Health to prepare a plan to improve suicide-related data and submit it by February 1, 2016.

Section 5 of this bill provides funding to the Department of Health for a statewide text message suicide prevention program.

Section 6 of this bill provides funding to the Department of Health for children and adolescents mental health first aid training.

Assumptions

It is assumed that any costs associated with the Board of Teaching rules identified in Section 1 of the bill will be the responsibility of the Board of Teaching.

It is assumed that the Department of Health will increase the hours of the current 0.5 FTE suicide prevention staff person to 1.0 FTE. The cost of the additional 0.50 FTE staff time is \$53,000 per year starting in FY 2016.

It is assumed that part of the increased time for the suicide prevention staff person will be used to oversee the two new grants identified in Section 2 of the bill. It is assumed the \$150,000 per year appropriated in Section 4 is for grants, and that additional funds would be appropriated for expenses related to monitoring and oversight of the grants. Monitoring and oversight of grants is required under Minnesota Statutes 16B and 16C. The staff person currently manages three suicide prevention grants totaling \$98,000 in addition to managing the Department of Healths other suicide-related activities, and cannot absorb additional grant management responsibilities within the current operations appropriation of \$48,000.

It is assumed that Section 3 of the bill is based on the 2015-2020 Minnesota State Suicide Prevention Plan currently being

drafted by the Department of Health and stakeholders. The workplan for completing the state plan anticipates that a detailed plan with action steps and timelines, based on best practices disseminated by the Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration, will be completed by July 2016. It is assumed that, in order to submit a detailed plan for the four tasks identified in Section 3 by February 1, 2016, the Department of Health will hire a full-time temporary Research Analyst for six months. The research position will have a one-time cost of \$28,000 in FY 2016.

It is assumed that the remainder of the increased staff time for the suicide prevention staff person will be used to arrange trainings through a variety of mechanisms for teachers, social service personnel, law enforcement, and others who come into contact with children with mental illness, as required by Section 6 of the bill.

Other overhead costs will be \$10,000 in FY 2016 and \$6,000 per year thereafter.
